Background:-

This was created by a group of college students on 02 October 1998. That time it was known Youth Chetana Club and after the registration got new name called- Jan Kalyan Samajik Sansthan.

Initially JKSS started working on youth development and further incorporated other development issues i.e. plantation, Sanitation, elementary education, health, skill and leadership development program for youth and women's, NRLM, HIV/AIDS, TB/RNTCP, Gram Sabha Empowerment, Agriculture and against social evils etc.

The organization is having strong coordination with different government departments/ agencies, National and International development partners, CSOs, Universities, Academia and professionals for support in implementation of various community based interventions.

Major Achievement:-

- 1. Labor registration of 388 families was done by th organization
- 2. Lac cultivation training was given to 30 SHG women so that they can ensure their livelihood by cultivation lac.
- 3. Under the Jal Jeevan Mission 40 village water & sanitation committee and 40 Jal Vanini Committee were formed in 40 village of Manpur Block.
- 4. The organization distributed books to 1000 girls for menstruation hygiene management under the LADLI project and organized awarness camps.
- 5. The number of patients in OPD has increased in PSC and CHC earlier.
- 6. 228 PLHIV has been linked under Link Workers schemes.
- 7. 100 Red Ribbon Club Committee was formed.
- 8. Condom Dipo Centre established in 100 Villages.
- 9. 1000 stakeholders were informed about HIV and health facilities.
- 10. Through the building capacity of self-help group, members started proper management, management, saving, banking, loaning, promotion of livelihood activities and documentation etc.
- 11. Under the link worker scheme project HIV testing of 10038 people and clinical services of 10204 people were done this year, in which 28 new HIV positive people were found who were linked to ART center.
- 12. Total 63790 free condoms and social marketing condoms have been distributed under link worker scheme project
- 13. With the help of NABARD esposure visits were made to 25 farmers for capacity building and adoption of technology.
- 14. The organization added 28 people under the social protection scheme.

Impact:

- 1. Women became proficient to run their own/ self-employment/ livelihood activities after leadership training.
- 2. 30 Women became proficient to run their own livelihood activities after Lac Cultivation training
- 3. Sixty farmers are farming through SRI method.
- 4. Increased production of coarse grains.
- 5. Women have become aware on domestic violence and arte of reporting/complaint has been increased.

- 6. Awareness on about HIV/AIDS and health issues were increased and PLHIV have started taking benefits of government schemes.
- 7. General population started picking condom from depot established at public places and using as well.
- 8. There has been awarness about menstrual hygiene management in tribal areas.
- 9. The people who were added under the social protection scheme are getting the benefits of the scheme.

Challenges faced:-

- As most of the village people are from PBL or tribal community, they are going to filed or forest for daily wages/livelihood hence not available to participate in each event.
- Most of the time, PRI officials not providing adequate or desired support to resolve the community issues.
- Access is difficult in geographically hilly or in remote area.
- Sometimes, block and district level government not coordinating as per the need.
- Due to misconceptions on HIV, community mobilization and motivation process need to be reviewed.
- General community is still having great stigma and discrimination against PLHIV.
- Lack of fund at project level is also one of the constraints for timely action and support to community.
- Staff dropout is a big challenge under HIV/AIDS prevention and control program.
- Weak documentation skills of SHGs leaders.
