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Message from the President

Dear Friends, supporters & esteemed stakeholders,

I am honoured to share the transformative impact of Jan Kalyan Samajik Sansthan (JKSS) during 2023–24. Through targeted interventions and unwavering dedication, we have addressed critical social challenges and empowered marginalized communities.

This year, our efforts under the Link Worker Scheme resulted in 17,711 HIV tests, identification of 29 new cases, and linking all to ART centers. Over 39,000 condoms were distributed through 200 depot centers, and 200 Red Ribbon Clubs were established to enhance awareness and preventive healthcare in rural areas.

Our community-driven water and sanitation initiative under the Jal Jeevan Mission mobilized 40 villages to improve water supply infrastructure, directly benefiting over 15,000 households. The Pre-School Nutrition and Rahat Program improved the nutritional status of 100 malnourished children, reducing stunting and underweight risks in tribal areas.

In livelihoods, we empowered 30 women through sustainable lac cultivation training, provided labour registration support to 388 families, and enhanced leadership skills for 30 SHG women leaders with NABARD's support. These programs have ensured economic independence and improved access to social security for vulnerable populations.

Our health camps in 16 villages reached 1,800 individuals, providing vital healthcare and HIV/AIDS awareness. Additionally, the Drug De-addiction Center rehabilitated 20 youths, and our Old Age Home enhanced the living standards of 10 elderly residents, reflecting our holistic approach to community care.

These achievements would not have been possible without the unwavering support of our donors, government agencies, and dedicated volunteers. Despite challenges such as limited funding, stigma, and geographical barriers, we remain committed to fostering sustainable development.

As we move forward, I invite our partners and funding agencies to continue supporting our mission to create self-reliant and equitable communities. Together, we can amplify our impact and ensure that no one is left behind.

- To receive donation or contribution from organizations, establishments, institutions, centers, and or persons for community relief work on such occasions

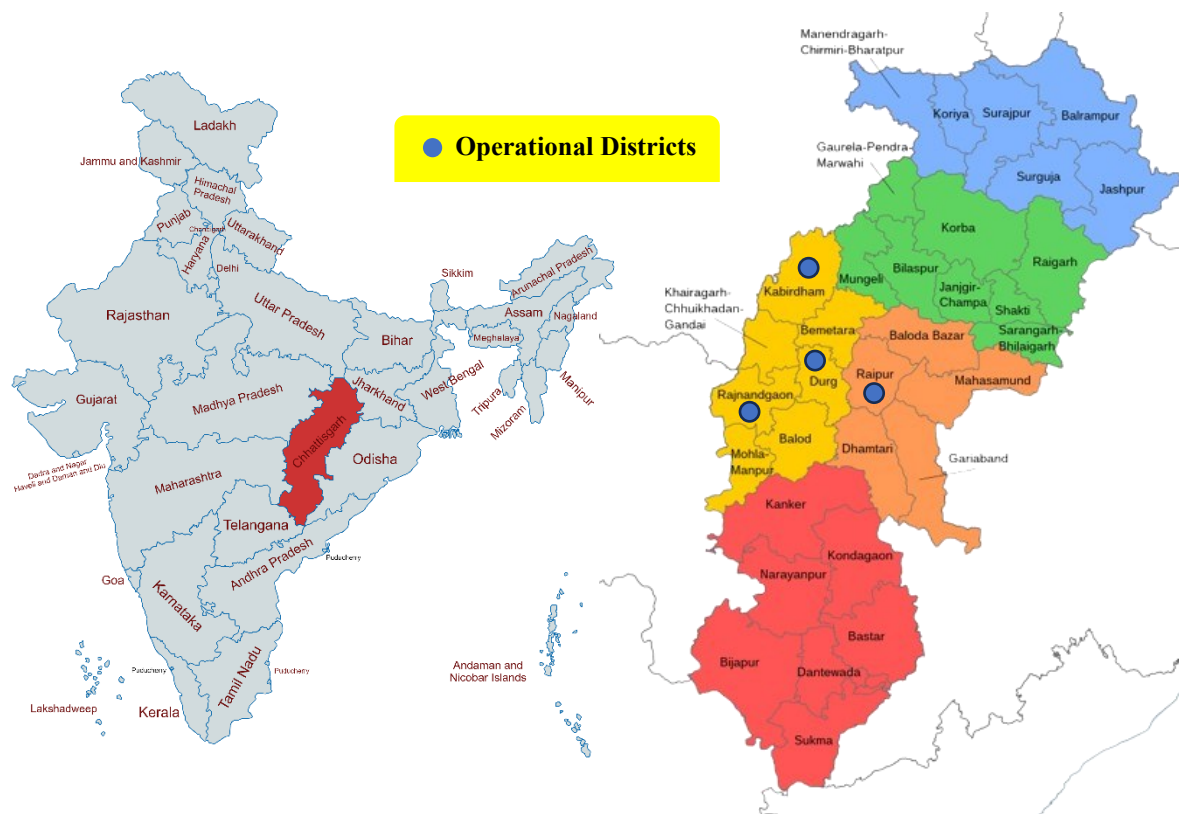
Areas of Intervention

Our Reach

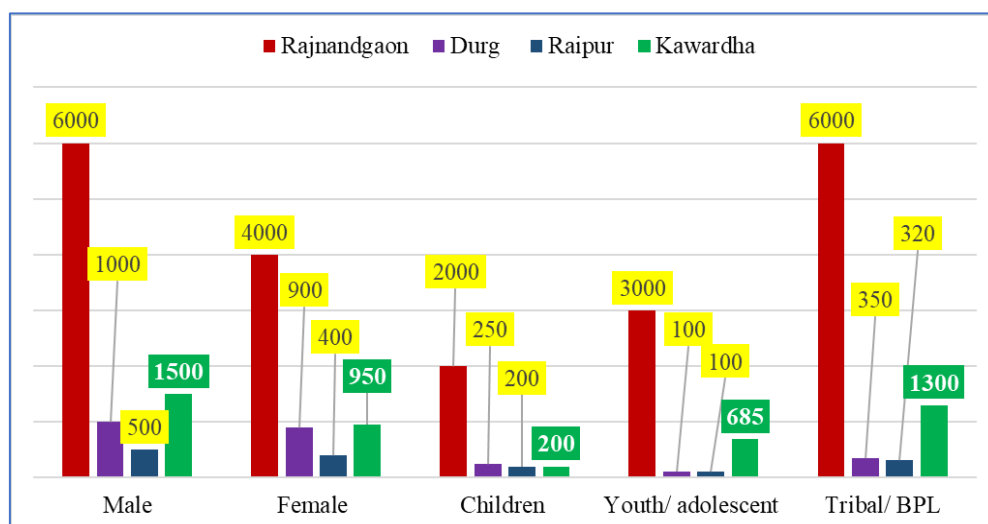
The operational area of JKSS encompasses the entire state of Chhattisgarh. Currently, the organization focuses on interventions in tribal-dominated districts, including Rajnandgaon, Kabirdham, and Durg. Additionally, JKSS is actively working in the districts of Raipur.

JKSS is actively working in the districts of Rajnandgaon, Durg, Raipur, and Kawardha, covering a significant number of Gram Panchayats (GPs) and villages.

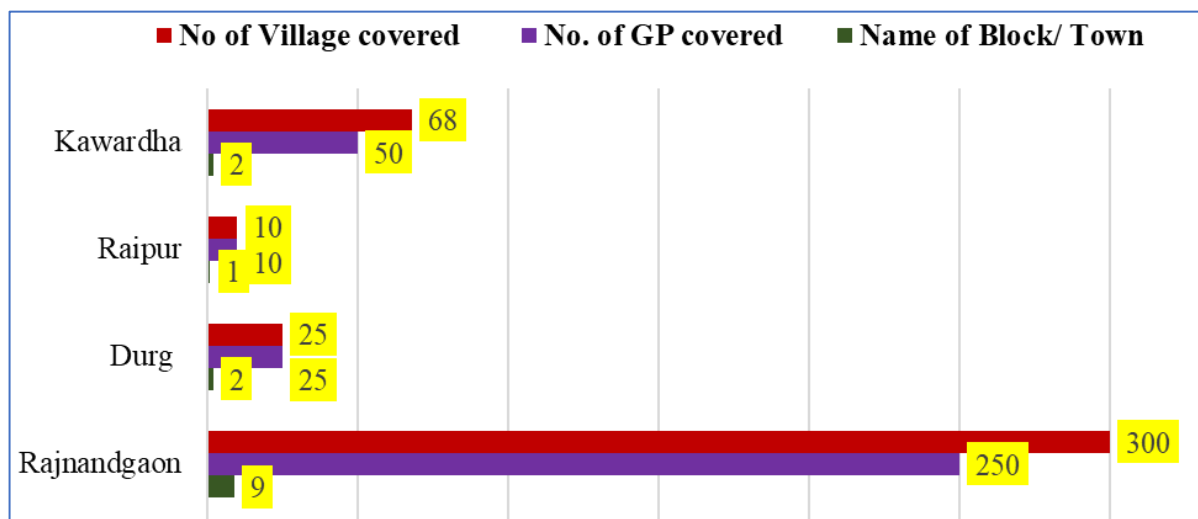


In Rajnandgaon, the organization operates in 9 blocks, covering 250 GPs and 300 villages, reaching 15,000 beneficiaries, including 6,000 males, 4,000 females, and 2,000 children.

The focus extends to 3,000 youth and adolescents, with a strong emphasis on tribal and BPL communities.

In Durg, JKSS covers 2 blocks, 25 GPs, and 25 villages, benefiting 2,600 individuals, including 1,000 males, 900 females, and 250 children. Additionally, 450 youth and adolescents are supported.

In Raipur, the organization operates in 1 block, 10 GPs, and 10 villages, reaching 1,020 beneficiaries, with 500 males, 400 females, and 200 children.



Finally, in Kawardha, JKSS works in 2 blocks, covering 50 GPs and 68 villages, benefiting 3,135 individuals, including 1,500 males, 950 females, and 200 children, with a focus on 1,985 youth and adolescents.

Major achievements : 2023-24

This year, Jan Kalyan Samajik Sansthan (JKSS) achieved remarkable progress across various initiatives. We enhanced labour registration, provided livelihood training, improved water and sanitation management, and promoted menstrual hygiene.

Here are the detailed highlights of our achievements:

- ✓ **HIV Testing and Clinical Services:** Conducted 17,711 HIV tests and provided clinical services to 17,560 individuals under the Link Worker Scheme, identifying 29 new HIV-positive cases linked to ART centers.
- ✓ **Condom Distribution and Depot Centers:** Established 200 Condom Depot Centers in 200 villages and distributed 39,494 free and socially marketed condoms.
- ✓ **Red Ribbon Clubs and HIV Awareness:** Formed 200 Red Ribbon Club Committees, educating 1,658 stakeholders and 2,000 volunteers about HIV prevention and health facilities.
- **Linking PLHIV and Social Protection:** Linked 264 PLHIV under the Link Worker Scheme and enrolled 50 individuals in social protection schemes.
- **Village Water and Sanitation Committees:** Trained 40 Village Water & Sanitation Committees and 40 Jal Vanini Committees under the Jal Jeevan Mission.
- ✓ **Self-Help Group Capacity Building:** Trained SHG members in management, savings, banking, loans, and livelihood promotion, strengthening operations and sustainability.
- ✓ **Lac Cultivation Training:** Provided lac cultivation training to 30 SHG women to ensure sustainable livelihoods.
- **Menstrual Hygiene Management:** Distributed books to 500 girls and organized menstrual hygiene awareness camps under the LADLI Project.
- **Education Learning Centers:** Established three Education Learning Centers in Manpur Block to enhance primary education outcomes.
- ✓ **Pre-School Nutrition and Support Program:** Provided milk, biscuits, and relief support to 100 children and families under the Pre-School Nutrition, Education, and Rahat Program.
- ✓ **Healthcare Access Improvements:** Increased OPD patient numbers in Primary and Community Health Centers, improving healthcare access.
- **Labor Registration:** Facilitated labour registration for 388 families, ensuring access to social security benefits.
- **Drug De-addiction Support:** Rehabilitated 20 youths through the Drug De-addiction Center.
- ✓ **Old Age Home Support:** Enhanced living conditions for 10 elderly residents with residential care and facilities.
- ✓ **Community Awareness on HIV and Health:** Engaged 1,658 stakeholders and 2,000 volunteers in discussions about HIV and health facilities under various initiatives.
- ✓ **Involvement of Local Communities in Learning:** Fostered collaborative learning by engaging local artists, elders, and youth in sharing knowledge and experiences in the villages.
- **Strengthening Livelihoods Through SHGs:** Encouraged SHGs to adopt better documentation practices and promoted livelihood activities for sustained economic growth.
- **Sustained Educational and Health Impact:** Regular follow-ups and interventions ensured continuity in education, improved health outcomes, and strengthened community involvement in various programs.

Impact created

This year 2023-24, Jan Kalyan Samajik Sansthan (JKSS) has generated significant impact across various sectors. Through leadership and livelihood training, women have gained proficiency in self-employment. Adoption of sustainable farming methods by farmers has led to increased grain production.

The initiatives undertaken by JKSS in the selected operational districts of Rajnandgaon, Durg, Kabirdham, and Raipur have contributed significantly to the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).



1. **No Poverty (SDG 1) and Zero Hunger (SDG 2):** Livelihood enhancement programs and sustainable farming practices help lift communities out of poverty and improve food security, addressing the goals of eradicating poverty and ending hunger.
2. **Good Health and Well-being (SDG 3):** Increased condom utilization and awareness of menstrual hygiene promote safe practices and better health outcomes, aligning with the goal of ensuring healthy lives and promoting well-being for all.
3. **Quality Education (SDG 4):** Distribution of books and awareness campaigns on menstrual hygiene contribute to improved education and awareness, promoting lifelong learning opportunities for all.
4. **Gender Equality (SDG 5):** Healthcare initiatives, including awareness campaigns on domestic violence and HIV/AIDS, empower women to assert their rights and access support services, contributing to gender equality.
5. **Clean Water and Sanitation (SDG 6):** Formation of village water and sanitation committees under the Jal Jeevan Mission enhances access to clean water and sanitation facilities, supporting efforts towards sustainable water management and sanitation.
6. **Decent Work and Economic Growth (SDG 8):** Economic empowerment initiatives, including leadership and livelihood training, promote decent work and sustainable economic growth, especially among marginalized communities.

Thus, JKSS's interventions align with multiple SDGs, contributing to the holistic development and well-being of communities in the operational districts.

Challenges Faced

In our operational districts of Rajnandgaon, Durg, Kabirdham, and Raipur, Jan Kalyan Samajik Sansthan (JKSS) faces several challenges that impact our ability to deliver effective support and services:

- **Community Participation:** Many villagers, particularly from PBL or tribal communities, prioritize daily wage work or forest-based livelihoods, making them unavailable for regular participation in events.
- **Inadequate Support from PRI Officials:** Local PRI representatives often fail to provide sufficient support to address community issues effectively.
- **Geographical Barriers:** Access to remote or hilly areas poses significant logistical challenges.
- **Limited Government Coordination:** Block and district-level government agencies sometimes lack alignment with program needs, affecting timely implementation.
- **HIV Misconceptions:** Persistent misconceptions about HIV necessitate a review of community mobilization and motivation strategies.
- **Stigma and Discrimination:** Deep-rooted stigma and discrimination against PLHIV continue to hinder effective community integration.
- **Funding Constraints:** Insufficient funding at the project level limits the ability to provide timely actions and support to communities.
- **Staff Retention:** High staff turnover remains a major challenge in HIV/AIDS prevention and control programs.
- **Skill Gaps in SHGs:** Weak documentation and management skills among SHG leaders hinder their operational efficiency.



Samarpan Old Age Home

SAMARPAN Old Age Home is dedicated to enhancing the quality of life for senior citizens by providing a safe, nurturing, and engaging environment. This home serves as a haven where elderly individuals can find comfort, companionship, and a sense of belonging. With a focus on holistic care, SAMARPAN ensures that its residents can stay physically active, mentally engaged, and socially connected.

The home organizes various games and competitions, offers access to TV and newspapers, and provides meals, including tea, breakfast, lunch, and dinner, ensuring the overall well-being of its residents. Additionally, the facility provides short-stay accommodations, making it a reliable support system for the elderly.

The De-Addiction Center is committed to addressing the root causes of addiction and guiding individuals toward long-term recovery and a healthier future. It provides a supportive environment to help patients reclaim their lives and reintegrate into society.

By providing training and skill development opportunities, this initiative equips women with the necessary knowledge and leadership abilities to effectively manage SHGs within their communities.

Mid Media Activities

JKSS organized a mid-media program under the Link Worker Scheme, reaching over 2,000 people in 35 villages of Rajnandgaon. Using film projectors, it spread vital awareness about HIV/AIDS prevention and stigma reduction, empowering communities with knowledge and fostering healthier choices.

Health Camps



JKSS, with support from CGSACS Raipur, organized health camps in 16 villages of Rajnandgaon, reaching 1,800 beneficiaries. These camps combined HIV/AIDS awareness with comprehensive health services, addressing the unique vulnerabilities of migrant communities. By providing education, diagnosis, and treatment, the initiative improved health outcomes and highlighted the need

for continued support for marginalized groups.

Main Objective: These health camps aim to address the rising concerns of HIV/AIDS among migrant populations by raising awareness and offering comprehensive healthcare services to tackle a range of health challenges.

Jal Jivan Mission

JKSS organized a community-driven initiative to improve village water supply infrastructure across 40 villages in Manpur Block and 40 in Mahasamund District, in collaboration with PHE Rajnandgaon and PHE Mahasamund. The program focused on mobilizing communities for the planning, implementation, and maintenance of village water supply systems, while assessing the need for Functional Household Tap Connections (FHTC) and encouraging their adoption for sustainable water access.

Main Objective- Engaging communities in planning, implementing, and managing village water supply systems while assessing and promoting the adoption of FHTC.

Place- 40 Villages in Manpur Block. & 40 Villages in Mahasamund District of Chhattisgarh

It successfully assessed and addressed the need for FHTC, improving access to clean water and enhancing overall quality of life in the villages.



This community-driven approach has proven highly effective in ensuring sustainable water management and improving access to clean drinking water. With measurable outcomes and active community participation, the program demonstrates a scalable model for addressing water supply challenges in rural areas.

This program contributed significantly to achieving **SDG 6: Clean Water and Sanitation** by ensuring access to safe and sustainable water supply through Functional Household Tap Connections (FHTC). By empowering communities to plan, implement, and manage water systems, it addressed water scarcity, improved sanitation, and promoted health and well-being, aligning directly with global sustainable development goals.

Chhattisgarh PLHIV Network Coordination Meeting

JKSS organized a coordination meeting on October 21, 2023, at its Rajnandgaon office to streamline efforts for HIV/AIDS prevention in the district. Supported by CGSACS, Raipur, the program focused on enhancing collaboration across projects and raising awareness through strategic planning and information sharing.

Main objective- The primary objective is to coordinate all district-level projects focused on HIV/AIDS prevention, ensuring streamlined operations, and enhancing community awareness.

This program demonstrated its effectiveness by fostering better coordination, optimizing resources, and driving measurable outcomes in HIV/AIDS prevention efforts. It



highlights a scalable model for enhancing community health and addressing critical challenges in a systematic manner.



The program directly supports **SDG 3: Good Health and Well-Being** by promoting effective strategies to combat HIV/AIDS. Through strengthened coordination and improved awareness, it contributes to reducing the spread of the disease and ensuring healthier communities.

Pre-School Nutrition and Rahat Program

JKSS organized a nutrition support program in the villages of Chawargaon, Kamkheda, and Murjhar in Manpur Block to combat stunting, wasting, and undernutrition among children aged 6 months to 5 years. Supported by the Jiv Daya Foundation, the initiative focused on providing daily milk to children and additional relief assistance to tribal families, addressing critical health and nutritional challenges.

Main objective- To address malnutrition by providing daily milk to 100 children aged 6 months to 5 years, preventing stunting, wasting, and undernutrition, while also extending essential Rahat support to 100 tribal families in the villages of Chawargaon, Kamkheda, and Murjhar.

Place- Chawargaon, Kamkheda & Murjhar of Manpur Block.

The program effectively improved child nutrition, reducing risks of stunting and underweight conditions while supporting tribal families with much-needed assistance. It fostered healthier growth and development in children and strengthened community resilience against malnutrition and food insecurity.

measurable outcomes.

It demonstrates the power of focused, community-based interventions in achieving long-term health and nutritional improvements.

Education Learning Center: Empowering Primary Education

JKSS, with support from Pagariya Foundation, Delhi, established Education Learning Centers in Chawargaon, Kamkheda, and Murjhar villages of Manpur Block. The initiative addresses learning gaps among 100 primary school children by enhancing their reading, writing, and math skills through interactive activities like games, music, stories, and group learning.

These centers provide a supportive environment to overcome hesitation and fear of studies, compensating for the lack of at-home revision due to parents' farming and household responsibilities. By fostering creativity and collaborative learning, the program helps children build confidence, improve academic performance, and sustain regular school attendance, ensuring a brighter future for them and their community.

Main objective: The Education Learning Center aims to address challenges in reading and writing among primary school children. It enhances skills in mathematics, Hindi, and cultural activities through playful methods like games, drawing, music, and stories, while fostering confidence and reducing fear of studies.
